On this twenty third day of ~~November~~
eighteen hundred and thirty two personally appeared
before the Superior Court of said County & State ~~James~~
C. Lewis aged seventy one years, who being first duly
sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the fol-
lowing declaration, in order to obtain the benefits of
the provisions made by the act of Congress passed
June 7, 1832: That he enlisted in the army of the
United States in the latter part of the year seventeen
hundred & seventy nine in the first part of the year seven-
teen hundred & eighty, (he thinks the latter,) with Capt.
John Mills, (the name of the recruiting officer not recollecting)
and served in the South Regiment of the Continental Line,
under the following named officers, to wit: Col. Dickson,
Major Murphy, Capt. John Mills, Lieutenant Farmer, &
Ensign Dickson, & served under the said officers until
he was discharged at the close of the war. At the time
of enlistment this declarant resided in the State of
North Carolina, in Orange County; he was in a battle at
Lindlay's Mills in North Carolina and also in another at
Wilcox's Iron works in the same State, both being battles
of detachments; the only States through ^{which} he marched were North
& South Carolina - he was in Charleston at the time of the

siege of that city, but at the time of the surrender was off
on duty with a small detachment, & thereby escaped
The said declarant was on the pension roll under the act of
March 18, 1818, & was dropped therefrom on account of
poverty, his residence then being in Giles County in the State
of Tennessee. He has since made application & under

stands that he has under the ~~pension~~ been restored to
the Pension Roll for the Agency of the State of Georgia
& is entitled to a pension from the 27th of March 1832.

The said Daniel Clower hereby relinquished every claim
whenever to a pension or annuity, except the present, &
he declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll
of any Agency in any State except that of the State
of Georgia as aforesaid. He also states that he delivered
his certificate of Pension some years since to the Hon. James
Memmister then a member of Congress from this State, &
that he hath not since seen the same, & the said James
hath removed from the State to some part of Tennessee
unknown to this declarant.

SCHEDULE.

Declaration, in order to be continued on the Pension List, under the Act of May 1st, 1820.

County of Gwynett ss. State of Georgia

On this 17th day of March 1831, personally appeared in open court, (a) being a court of record (b) for the [district, circuit, county, or corporation, as the case may be,] *Benjamin Blount* resident in said county, aged *sixty eight* years, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the acts of Congress, of the 18th March, 1818, and the 1st of May, 1820; that he, the said *Benjamin Blount* enlisted (c) for the term of *one year* on the *not recalled* day of *February* in the year *1780* in the State of *North Carolina* in the company (d) commanded by captain *John Miller* in the regiment commanded by colonel *Dixon* in the line of the State of *North Carolina* on the *Military* continental establishment; that he continued to serve in the said corps (or vessel) until *April* day *not recalled* 1781 when he was discharged from the service in *the State of South Carolina*; that he hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension, except the present; that his name has been placed on the pension list, that the number of his pension certificate is *not recalled*; and that he never before exhibited a schedule of his property, because (e) *until his fortune* *surrounding misfortune had stripped him of his little property & age & infirmity* *had placed it in his hands he considered that the country of his country would* *not under the act of Congress be extended to him.*

And, in pursuance of the act of the 1st May, 1820, I do solemnly swear, (or affirm, as the case may be,) that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March, 1818, and that I have not, since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts, or debts due to me; nor have I any income, other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. (f) That, since the 18th of March, 1818, the following changes have been made in my property. (g)

At that time there was due me about eight hundred Dollars. Of this sum three hundred & fifty Dollars was expended in the purchase of a lot of land which was extended to the use of me Archibald McQueen in Tennessee at the expending 500 of me all the profits arising from said land for three years with the exception of 100 Dollars which would have been

to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts, or debts due to me; nor have I any income, other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. (f) That, since the 18th of March, 1818, the following changes have been made in my property. (g)

At that time there was due me about eight hundred Dollars
Of this sum three hundred & fifty Dollars was expended
in the purchase of a steel horse, which was estimated to
cost of one Archibald Wilson's property. ³⁵⁰
³⁰⁰ all the profits arising from said horse ⁵⁰

³⁵⁰ & I have not nor ever expect to recover any part of the purchase
³⁰⁰ of such said horse. Three hundred Dollars of said first mentioned
³⁷ sum was paid in ¹³³ for the purchase of a tract of land
⁸²⁰ (copy of deeds to which are herewith enclosed) & the said tract of
land was conveyed by me to my son John Wilson
discharge of a debt of three hundred Dollars which I was
owing him. I also learned to the best of my knowledge Archibald
Wilson thirty seven Dollars in the year 1814 which I have
not recovered nor have I any prospect of it. In the year
1819 I was compelled to pay as security for William
Wilson administrator of the Estate of John Berry deceased
one hundred & thirty three Dollars.

I also owned on the said 18th of March 1818 a wagon &
four horses & two cows & calves. The cows and calves were sold
in Tennessee for twenty five Dollars ^{in 1819} & others purchased in
place of them after my removal to this State they were
sold to the same Archibald Wilson. Since that time all my
property ^{have since} except those mentioned in the annexed
Schedule - ^{four} two of my horses have also died - my wagon
nearly worn out & sold to one William Rogers for forty
Dollars, twelve Dollars & 50 cents of which is still due, the
balance of the income of my own labour has been expended
in the support of my family.

I beg leave further to state that I have assumed that ^{my name}

& suffering for my country I have never received in any manner
compensation save four Dollars upon enlistment, one a half &

The fact is nevertheless as before stated it, & for these more than three years of laboring & suffering for my country, I have never received in any manner any compensation save from the following, one shirt & one pair of pantaloons or overalls, & forty six dollars as pension money in 1789 & 1800. I am now sixty eight years of age with no family; but my wife sixty six years of age, both of us infirm & unable to perform any severe labour. Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Daniel Morgan Clower, of Orange County, North Carolina.

There is no claim for pension or bounty land on file based upon the military service in the Revolutionary War of a Daniel Morgan Clower, of of a Morgan Clower. The record has been found of a Daniel Clower, who enlisted in Orange County, North Carolina. That record is furnished you herein, as found in the claim for pension, S.37865, based upon his military service in the Revolutionary War.

The date and place of birth and the names of the parents of Daniel Clower are not shown.

While residing in Orange County, North Carolina, Daniel Clower enlisted in February, 1780, served one year as a private in Captain Mills' Company, Colonel's Archibald Lytle's and Henry Dixon's North Carolina Regiment and was in the battles of Lindley's Mills and Wilson's Iron Works and at the siege of Charleston, South Carolina.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 6, 1819, while a resident of Giles County, Tennessee, at which time, he stated that he was in his fifty-ninth year and referred to one of his little sons but gave no name.

In 1831, he was living in Grinnett County, Georgia, and stated that he was sixty-eight years of age and that his wife, name not given, was aged sixty-six years and that he had a son, John.

There are no further data as to soldier's family.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, the name and address of person paid and possibly the date of death of the Revolutionary War pensioner, Daniel Glover(S.37004), you should address the Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, this city, and cite the following data:
