CLEARFIELD

ISHAM PHILIPS, b. in Ga., 1741; d. in Henry Co., Ga., 1837. Served as a private under Col. Clarke, Ga. Militia. Married Mary Dawson.

GEORGE PHILLIPS, b. in Va., 1758; d. 1849 in Ga. Served as private, Va. Line. Married 1790, Sarah Lavell.

ISAAC PHILLIPS, b. 1741, Savannah, Ga.; d. 1837, Henry Co., Ga. Served as private, Ga. Troops. Married Mary Dawson.

MARK PHILLIPS, b. in Ireland, 1755; d. 1839 in Ga. Applied for Pension, 1819, which was granted. Served as private, N. C. Militia, under Capt. Samuel Jones. Married Raney Moore, b. 1753.

JOHN PHINAZEE, b. in Ireland, 1760; d. Harris Co., Ga., 1837. Served as private, S. C. Line. Received bounty grant of land for his services, in Ga. Married 1788, Sarah Harris (1765-1856).

WILLIAM PIERCE (or Pearce), b. in Ga., 1740; d. Dec. 10, 1789, Savannah, Ga. He entered the Continental Army and became aide-de-camp to Gen. Nathaniel Greene. Member Sons of Liberty, Savannah, Ga. Charter member, Society of the Cincinnati. Married Charlotte Fenwick (dau. of Edward Fenwick of S. C.). After his death, she mar. (2) EBENEZER JACKSON of Mass., REV. SOLDIER (son of GEN. MICHAEL JACKSON of Mass.). In 1781, Continental Congress presented a sword to MAJOR WILLIAM PIERCE for his services.

Child: (only)

1. WILLIAM LEIGH PIERCE, of Savannah, Ga., a REV. SOLDIER of Effingham Co., Ga. His homestead was built on the original grant of land given to him by George III of England. This home was made doubly historic, for in 1825, his son Stephen Pearce entertained Marquis de La Fayette on his visit to the South.

NOTE: In 1791, Gen. George Washington, on his memorable visit to Georgia, spent the night at the home of JOSHUA PEARCE (Pierce), brother of MAJOR WILLIAM PIERCE.
