State of Georgia 3 On this the eighteenth day  
Noamis County 3 of July 1832

Wm. H. C. Haven Just. of the Superior  
=erior in & for said County & State the said  
Shadrach Kainer a resident of said State & County  
aged eighty seven years who being first duly  
sworn according to law doth on his oath  
make the following declaration in order to  
obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed  
June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832. That he entered the service of the  
United States in the North Carolina Militia  
some time in the year 1779 the month not  
recollected but the weather was mild under  
Captain Laurens Briaunt for a ~~three~~ months  
time that the name of his Major he forgets  
his General name was Briaunt  
That he was stationed the ~~three~~ months  
at Newbern in Craven County North  
Carolina placed on guard over the Jail  
Prisoners. And at the end of the said three  
months he was discharged and that  
he afterwards entered the service of  
the United States in the North Carolina  
Militia some time in the year 1782 the  
months not recollected but the weather  
was cool under the same officer  
Captain Laurens Briaunt for an  
other ~~three~~ months time that the name of his  
Major he forgets his General name was  
Briaunt that he was again stationed  
a short time at Newbern in Craven County

North Carolina as a guard over the Long  
Prisoners and from there was marched  
towards Wilmington for the purpose of  
giving relief to that place as it was  
understood that the British had  
possession of it. But before making  
that point news reached them that  
the British had evacuated that  
place. When this news reached  
them they were within ten miles  
of Wilmington and they then turned  
their march towards the interior  
that he was in no battle and  
that at the expiration of the term  
for which he entered this second  
service he was discharged that  
he served through out both tours  
in the character of a private sol-  
dier and that from his extreme  
age and bodily infirmity he is  
unable to attend in open Court  
without manifest inconvenience  
the name of his Lieutenant was  
Lewis Lewis his Ensign was John  
Ewin & James Howe was his Drum-  
mer & Jacob Howe his Corporal that  
his memory being being lead as to names  
he does not recollect the names of any  
other officers of the company and that the  
service he rendered was during the latter  
part of the War & that he never received any  
pay for the same. He hereby relinquishes every  
claim whatever to a pension or annuity  
except the pleases and declares that this

name is not on the Pension roll of the  
Agency of any State.

of Harris State of Georgia do hereby declare  
his opinion after the investigation of the

name applicant was a Revolutionary  
Soldier & served as he states. And the said  
Justice further certifies that the said app-  
licant could not attend in open Court  
without manifest inconvenience from  
his extreme old age & feebleness and further

Dear Madam:

The data which follow were obtained from papers on file in the pension claim, R. 9046, based on the military service of Shadrach Rowe.

The date and place of his birth and the names of his parents were not given.

He applied for pension on July 18, 1850, at which time he was eighty-seven years of age and was living in Harris County, Georgia.

He alleged that he enlisted in 1779 in the North Carolina militia, served three months as private under Captain Council Briant and was engaged in guarding the Tory prisoners at Newbern, Craven County, North Carolina; that he enlisted in 1782 and served three months in the North Carolina militia as private under Captain Council Briant.

His claim for pension was not allowed as he failed to furnish proof of the alleged service, in accordance with the requirement of the pension law.

He stated that James Rowe served as drummer and Jesse Rowe served as fifer with him during the Revolution but he did not give relationship. The papers in this claim contain no further family data.
