State of Georgia } On this the 19th day of September
Albert County } 1832 personally appeared before
the sitting } the Judge of the Superior Court
"in and for said County Louis Stowers a residen-
-nt in the State and County aforesaid aged
sixty eight or nine years who being first duly sworn
according to law, doth, on his oath, make the
following declaration, in order to obtain the
benefit of the provision made by the act of
Congress passed June the 7th 1832 that he enlisted
in the Army of the United States in the year 1781
with Col Taylor and served in the Virginia Gren-
Coat Regiment under the following named officers viz
Capt Richard White Adjutant - Burston & Col Taylor
that he enlisted under Col Taylor in the month of Decem-
-ber 1781 that he was a Citizen of Orange County Virginia
at the time of his enlistment but enlisted in Alber-
-marle County Va. that he was enlisted for the
purpose of guarding the British & Hessian called
Burgoyne's Men, that were stationed in Albemarle
County Virginia ^{during their stay in Albemarle County} he states that he marched from
thence as a guard of said prisoners through Orange
Culpeper & Spotsylvania to Winchester & from thence
nearly to the Allegany ~~Mountain~~ ^{Mount} & from thence
back again to Winchester he states that he con-
-tinued in the service from the time of his enlist-
-ment until April or May 1783 when he was
discharged by Col Taylor and has since lost
his discharge that he has no person now living
-ing within his knowledge by whom to prove
his service he states that he moved from
Orange County Virginia to the State of Georgia
& settled in Albert County forty two years ago when

he has needed ever since - he hereby relinquish
his every claim whatever to a pension or annuity
except the present, and he declares that his
name is not on the pension roll of any State
or Territory sworn to and subscribed the day and
year aforesaid in open Court (Louis ^{his} ~~Stowers~~ ~~Stowers~~
Jest B. Houston ~~Att~~)

do hereby declare my opinion that the above named
Louis Stowers was a revolutionary soldier, and
served as he states

Dear Madam:

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim U. 31996, it appears that Lewis Stowers, while a resident of Orange County, Virginia, enlisted in December 1781 and served as a private until April or May, 1782 in Captain White's Company, Colonel Taylor's Regiment which guarded the British and Russian prisoners confined at the barracks in Albemarle County, Virginia.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 19, 1832, while a resident of Elbert County, Georgia, aged sixty-eight or sixty-nine years. The date and place of his birth are not stated.

He died November 22, 1844.

There are no data on file as to his family.
