who was a soldier in the revolutionary war
and who served in said war and a pensioner upon
his death and the time and amount of his service
will appear upon the papers in the war department

She further declares that
she was married to the said ~~David~~^{William} Swan
on the 19th day of October in the
year ~~eighteen hundred and ninety~~^{seventeen} that her husband
the aforesaid ~~David~~^{William} Swan died on
the ~~seventeenth~~^{seventeenth} day of August eighteen hundred
and forty ~~one~~^{one} that she was not married to
him prior to the service but the
marriage took place previous
to the second of January eighteen
hundred and ~~forty one~~^{forty one} viz at the time above

eight. To the second he answers that the record of his
age was in his fathers Bible, and that he is unable to
say where it is now. To the 3rd he answers that he was
living in the same County or above, and that since that
time he has lived in Morgan Jasper, and Newton
Counties of this State, and that he has for the last
six years, & now does live in Harris County of the
said State. To the he answers that he volunteered the
first time and was drafted the second time, and that
he never was a substitute. To the Major Genl. James
Glenigon, Genl. Davison Col. Lock Capt Charles
Palk, Genl. Kuther, Col. Robert Smith
and Major Graham and the General circumstan
ces are as relates in my Declaration above. To the
answers that he received two discharges one from
Garniel Glenigon and one from Capt Charles Palk
by the John M. Gray and John H. Green and many
others were it necessary

Declaration of William Givens

In order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress
of the 7th of August 1832

On this twentieth day of June personally appeared

William Givens a resident of the County of State
apone is aged seventy four years, who being
first duly sworn according to Law doth on
his oath make the following declaration
in order to obtain the benefit of the provision
made by the act of Congress passed June 30th
1832. That he entered in the service of the
United States in the year seventeen hundred &
eighty on the first of June with Major James
Coys and General Blainham troop of Riflemen
and marched with Captain Martins Troop of Dragoons
= and that he left said service on the 7th of Septem
ber 1780 by being regularly discharged therefrom that
he resided at that time in the County of Wiedenberg in the
State of North Carolina and that he entered said
service as a volunteer and that he was engaged in
the Battle of Bakers Lane in the State of South
Carolina and that he marched through Lancaster
District of the State last mentioned Genl Givens
last Lock ever at this period to wit from the 1st of
June until the seventh of September in the year 1780
the principal commanding officer. And this depone
= ent further saith on oath that he again entered in said
service at the United States in the State of North Carolina
on the first day of September seventeen hundred & eig
= ty two

with Captain Charles Polk's company of Light Dragoons
- was in an expedition under Genl. Burtleson and
Colonel Robert Smith and Major Graham
and that he served therein as a Light Dragoon three
months and that he was regularly discharged
from said service on the 1st of December ~~1862~~
- a hundred and eighty two that he resides at
that time in the State of North Carolina Mecklenburg
County and that he married through the County
of Surry and City of Fayetteville in Cumberland
County - and this Depoent saith that adding both
terms of service together that they make six months
and seven days which period of time this Depoent
on oath saith that he really served in the army
of the United States in the State of North
Carolina and that he did not within that wh-
-le period of time follow any legal pursuit
whatevise and that the first term to the best of
his belief was served as a volunteer and the second as
a drafted Dragoon - and this Depoent saith that
the only documentary evidence he hath of said service
is the original certificates of his discharge which
are hereto attached marked A. & B. He saith that
he is aware of no living person whose testimony he can
procure to prove the above service - He hereby
relinquishes every claim subsistence to a pension
or an annuity as yet the present and declares
that his name is not on the pension roll of any
agency in any State

Dear Madam:

The data contained herein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, R.10333, based upon the Revolutionary War service of William Swan.

He was born in 1758 in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina.

While a resident of said Mecklenburg County, he enlisted June 1, 1780 and served as a private in Samuel Flenellen's North Carolina troop of riflemen, and was discharged September 7, 1780. He enlisted September 1, 1782 and served as a private in Captain Charles Polk's North Carolina company of light dragoons in an expedition with General Rutherford, and was discharged December 1, 1782.

After the Revolution he lived in Morgan, Jasper and Newton Counties, Georgia.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 10, 1833, then a resident of Harris County, Georgia, where he had lived six years.

He died August 17, 1849 in Harris County, Georgia.

He married Rachel, the daughter of William Brown, October 19, 1790 as stated by the widow; and as stated by one who was present at the marriage "between the

years 1795 and 1800".

In 1850 the widow, Rachel, was living in Harris County, Georgia, and then aged eighty-one years.

There is no reference to children.
